





A one inch mussel may have up to 600 byssal threads holding it in place.


### Lake Texoma April 3, 2009




## Possible range in the Trinity River Basin



#### **APPLESNAILS**


In the 1950s, *Pomacea* spp. Became popular in the aquarium trade.





### APPLESNAIL Pomacea insularum


Originally called *P. canaliculata* or *P. canaliculata*-complex, it currently occurs in seven Texas counties) and has been expanding its range for at least 10 years.



Studies in 2009 failed to find rat lungworm (*Angiostrongylus* cantonensis) in Texas applesnails, but this parasite does occur in populations in New Orleans.


### GIANT RAMS-HORN SNAIL Marisa cornuarietis

Reported present in the San Marcos and Comal rivers, but not in the San Antonio (Karatayev and Burlakova 2007).



### RED-RIM MELANIA Melanoides tuberculatus

This species can serve as a host for Chinese liver fluke *Clonorchis sinensis* and Oriental lung fluke *Paragonimus westermani.*
