
 2009 Sunset Commission raised issue of exotic aquatic plants and directed the Department to:

"provide greater information to the public on the harm caused by releasing exotic species."




- Giant Salvinia (Salvinia molesta)





Once Giant Salvinia invades, it chokes lakes and suffocates fish. And when introduced to Texas lakes, it can double in size every seven days and completely take over.



What is giant salvinia?

A native of Brazil, giant salvinia (salvinia molesta) is a floating, rootless aquatic fern that can double its size in less than a week. In the United States, giant salvinia began as a popular aquarium plant and was then introduced to the wild.

It was first found in Texas in 1998, and to date has been reported in over a dozen water bodies in Texas.
