Only one point in keys (upper)


2006 one fish off St. Pete

3 more fish (3 locations) collected off N coast Yucatan; most by fishermen (Alfonso Aguilar-Perera at UADY)




Two fish (2 locations) off Manatee County; one fish off Pinellas county

Eleven more fish off N side Yucatan




8 fish in North GOM

#### **News from James Morris/NOAA:**

- NOAA formed a Lionfish Working Group last month with reps from all line offices
- James is working closely with Dept. of State on international issues on lionfish
- First international workshop on lionfish took place in Aug in Cancun and established a framework for lionfish best management practices (manual is in progress and is being coordinated by James)
- The NOAA Eat Lionfish Campaign is bringing increased attention to the issue domestically.
