

- Background information of invasive swamp eel
 - Multiple populations across the US
 - Commonly released as bait or cultural/religious activity
 - We took a field trip to see them in store!
- New findings of concerning ecological cascading impacts from FIU
 - Potentially, 90% loss of crayfish, 90% loss of two native fish species, and a 60% decline in one of the most abundant fish species that birds rely on for food
